

## Quentin Adelbert "Q" Pearson

Quentin Adelbert "Q" daughter. He served as Pearson was born in a deacon at the Second Wynot, Neb., on March 13, 1918 and died in Reno, Nev. on June 14, 2014, 96 years young. He grew up in Seattle, Wash. and started college there before the beginning of World War II. During the war, he was



a tower operator at Boeing Field and was later employed by Pan-Am flying troops to the Hawaiian islands and Australia. In February of 1947, he married Jean Harris of Coral Gables, Fla. Shortly thereafter, they transferred to New York where he continued to work with Pan-Am. Their next transfer was in 1950 to Florida, where Q briefly resumed studying at the University of Miami. But, in 1951 he transferred to San Francisco where he started a pool business called SwimQuip, and consulted on the building of gunite swimming pools in Bangkok and Beirut. After another transfer to London, they returned to New York in 1958. There, Q entered the "jet age," learning to captain the Boeing 707 and 747, on which he finished the last ten years of his flying career. Q and Jeani settled in Greenwich, Conn. where they

and was a charter member of the Burning Tree Country Club. Captain "Q" retired in 1978 after 36 years with Pan American Airways and was honored for his "flawless, non-damage re-

cord." The next year, Q and Jeani moved to Ormond Beach, Fla., where they lived happily for 35 years. He volunteered in Florida with various non-profits and enjoyed many sunsets over the inland waterway at their back door. He sang with the Ormond Beach Methodist Church choir for many years. At the age of 82, Q finally finished his course work and attained his dream of graduating with a degree from the University of Miami. Q is survived by his wife, Jeani, his son, Tog and wife Doreen, his daughter Trevlig and husband Jim, seven grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Memorial service plans will be announced.
