You Can't Make This Stuff Up - A True Story

In the mid-sixties, early 70s, some crazy things were going on in the skies of America. This is one of those stories.

The major airlines who had not hired any pilots in years suddenly started hiring thousands of pilots in 1965. The starting salary was \$450 per month. The majority of these new hires were military pilots, many of these "hot shots" joined guard or reserve squadrons to supplement their incomes.

Rick Smith was a TWA new hire. Rick was known as "Mr. A-4", having over 2,000 hours and a combat tour in the "Skyhawk".

Bruce Jones was a Pan Am new hire. Bruce was a P8 "Crusader" pilot – Bruce never flew the A-4.

Both Rick and Bruce joined VMA 131 at "Floyd Bennett Field, Brooklyn New York, flying A-4s. Bruce was scheduled to go to Cherry Point NC for ground school and FAM flights in April 1966.

One fine day in March of 1966, Rick "Mr A-4" had signed up to fly a routine flight, but being on reserve with TWA, he was called out and could not cancel his flight with his reserve unit. Bruce, the "Crusader" sitting at home, so he went to Floyd Bennet Field to hang out and study A-4 manuals.

You Can't Make This Stuff Up - A True Story

Now Rick Smith and Bruce Jones, both new to the squadron, were both approximately the same height, weight, brown hair, so when Tom saw a pilot sitting in the ready room reading an A-4 manual, and knowing Rick Smith was scheduled to fly today – parts problem solved.

Tom walks into the ready room and says, "Hey, I want you to take a part down to McGuire – you don't even have to shut down – land, drop off the part and come back. Listen, I'll give you 2 AFTP's (additional flight time periods) (2 days for one hour's work)".

Bruce says, "You want me to fly an A-4 to McGuire, and you will give me two days' pay?" Tom says, "Yeah!" Bruce says, "No sweat!"

Bruce goes into the locker room, finds someone's flight gear, suits up and down to the flight line. He is assigned a plane and goes out to the line. Bruce steps in and gets the crewman to help start the A-4 – off he goes, lands at McGuire, drops off the part and flies back to New York.

Cleaning up in the lock room, Tom says to Bruce, "How did it go?" "Piece of cake", says Bruce, "except I couldn't figure out how to get the dam-gear handle* up, but – I asked the pilot at McGuire and he explained it to me."

Tom says, "You flew to McGuire with the gear down?" Bruce said, "That's right." Tom, "You got 2000 hours in the A-4 and you don't know how to raise the gear?" "2,000 hours, I've never been in an A-4 in my life!" Tom: "You ain't Rick Smith?" Bruce, "Hell no, I'm Bruce Jones!"

Tom says - "I'll pay the 2 AFTPs - do not ever tell this story, and you're still going to Cherry Point next month."

This is a true story, only the names were changed to protect the idiots involved. I told you crazy stuff was going on.
